PHYSICAL HEALTH



Ministry is demanding, also physically, and we must take care of our bodies to serve God effectively for the long term. Physical health is part of our stewardship.

Ignoring physical health can lead to burnout, illness, or fatigue, which hinders ministry effectiveness.

Prioritize Exercise: Aim for regular physical activity 3 to 4 times a week.

Eat Healthy: Healthy eating is a way to glorify God with our bodies. (1 Cor 10:31 NIV)

Prioritize Rest: Rest is not laziness; it is trusting God to sustain the work. (Psalm 127:2 ESV)

Embrace a Holistic View of Health: Our well-being in all areas is important to God and impacts our ministry. (3 John 1:2 NKJV)

Mental health is essential, not optional. Self-care enables you to care for others. Just like an oxygen mask, your well-being comes first.

The Reality Behind the Stories:

Eli struggled as a father and avoided necessary confrontation.

Samson wrestled with destructive impulses.

Moses lived as a fugitive.

Elijah experienced exhaustion, despair, and deep emotional distress.

Paul spent significant time in prison.

What the Great Commission Requires. This is a God-sized assignment. It demands Spirit-filled churches. It requires spiritual power, not just clever planning.



Replenish & Recover

More than ever, leaders cannot afford to neglect intentional time for retreat, reflection, and refocus if they hope to remain spiritually healthy and whole.



No game or race is completed without halftime or pit stops, because progress requires pause, adjustment, and refuelling.

In ministry, personal pit stops allow leaders to reflect on direction and make necessary mid-race corrections.

As Ruth Barton notes, healthy leadership depends on a rhythm between active engagement and intentional retreat in God's presence for the sake of one's own soul.



Leadership Support: Ensuring that leadership teams are equipped and inspired to pursue church growth passionately.

The church needs spiritually mature, servant-hearted leaders who are trained, equipped, and passionate about guiding, supporting, and serving others in spreading the gospel.



Sacred Service: Understanding the privilege of serving the Lord with a transformative message.
